First, classes were cancelled and delayed due to a pneumonic plague "epidemic." Then Cyclone Ava hit on January 5th, 2018 -- damaging infrastructure up and down the East Coast (and cancelling our annual holiday letter as we had no power for weeks). A few months of "normalcy" returned and then public schools and government offices began to strike for salary increases. By the time the school year ended, our high school 12th graders had been in school for nearly 12 months.

HELP programming continued despite the delays, but it was a year that never seemed to find its own rhythm. This year, many schools started in November to give an actual vacation between the two school years. Now we are awaiting the official results of Madagascar's presidential election. Both candidates have been president in the past, so we hope their experience will be an asset for positive change – we can dream!
